## Manresa House Ranchi

May 2020 began with the celebration of the feast of St. Joseph, the Worker. And as we began Marian Month this day, we offered special prayers through the intercession of our Lady for those infected by Coronavirus. This day also brought us another golden opportunity to render our service in XISS. Our juniors and a few fathers gladly extended their helping hand in making food packets for distribution among the people in need. This day brought us sad news too, as one of the nephews of Fr.

Alex Tirkey passed away in Medica.

On 3rd May Fr. John Jyoti Kujur went to Muri Shelter Home to help Fr. Binod Toppo and Team in taking care of inmates. On 5th May, three deacons, namely, Ajit Kerketta, Bimal Nag and Bimal Minj left for Dorea (Tamar) Shelter Home to render their service to the inmates over there. On the same day, we received some packets of rice, dal, chana, potato and onion from some generous people like XISS and St. Xavier's College. Our juniors made about 850 food packets ready for distribution. Fr Ignatius Minj, assistant PP of Kanke Parish, took 244 food packets on 8th May to distribute among the identified poor and needy of Kanke area. The rest were distributed among stranded students, labourers, our employees and the needy people of Bahubazar, Singpur, Lalpur, Barwan compound, Barhitoli, Kumhartoli, Kantatoli, Khadgarha, Gungutoli, Kadru, Loadih, Bargawan, Hindpiri Toppo Basti, Pisca Mor, Kokar area.

On 7th May, Bro Telesphore Horo and two deacons, Dn Claver Minj and Dn Elphiz Kerketta, went to Muri Shelter Home to replace Fr Binod Toppo and Fr. John Jyoti Kujur. When Fr Binod and Fr John came back, they looked quite satisfied with their committed life and selfless service.

May 14th was observed by the community as A Day of Prayer, Fasting and Works of Charity. After a short break, juniors started packing food materials for distribution. In fact they were involved in the works of charity the whole month either in Shelter Homes or in XISS.

On 21st May all the community members were at home. Our juniors and priests from Shelter Homes had already come back. On this day we came together to celebrate Holy Eucharist. There was a beautiful moment of faith sharing and sharing of rich experiences of Shelter Homes. On this occasion prayed for all the people affected by unprecedented lockdown and for the speedy recovery of those infected by Novel Coronavirus.

On 23rd May, Fr Ajit Kumar Xess, SJ took over as the New Provincial of Ranchi Province in a simple ceremony at Sadbhavna, Jesuit Provincial's Residence, Ranchi. Fr Rector and Fr. Alex Tirkey were the witnesses from Manresa House. The very next day, he visited the Manresa House Infirmary and met all our senior citizens. They were very happy to see the New Provincial. This is the first house he visited after assuming the office of Provincial. This shows his great love for the old and sick who are the sources of inspiration for many of us.

XISS gave us another opportunity to serve the people in need which began on 25th May. Our juniors once again fully involved themselves in the works of charity and got 2500 packets ready for distribution among the needy. Thanks to XISS for giving us such opportunity to serve people for two months. Our heartfelt appreciation goes to our juniors who happily extended their helping hand and selfless service.

We concluded the month with the celebration of Pentecost and the blessing of the Holy Spirit.

## Assam Mission

### JESUIT BHAVAN AND GANA CHETANA SAMAJ, TEZPUR

**Visitors** : On May 29, 2020 Fr Anupchand Kiran Minj, SJ came to our community from Jagriti, Guwahati and stayed with us for a couple of days. It was a kind of home coming for him getting in touch with the spirit of the community which was once so dear to him. He left for his destination on May 31, 2020 after breakfast. Fr Anup, you are always welcome; your presence is

a blessing for us. On May 31, 2020 Fr Xavier Lakra, SJ came to stay with us since his community, SXC, Sonabheel has been turned into a quarantine centre. The centre will begin functioning from June 01, 2020. The Local administration took the decision to have a quarantine centre at St. Xavier's Junior college building and as a precautionary measure, Fr Xavier Lakra, SJ who is a heart patient, has been advised to stay away from the campus. Fr Xavier, hearty welcome to you and wish you a very happy stay with us.

**St. Joseph's Feast** : On May 01, 2020, together with the staff members of GCS and domestic workers of the house we had a special Holy Mass in honour of St. Joseph, the patron of all the workers. It was a concelebrated Holy Mass with Fr. Pius Xalxo, SJ, the main celebrant, where- in we prayed through the intercession of the saint of the day for the protection and guidance of the staff members and domestic workers and their families. Fr Pius in his introduction, highlighted the historical development of the "Workers' Day" in relation to the present situation of the workers. In his sermon he spoke about the dignity of human labour and enumerated the virtues of St. Joseph inviting all the participants to imbibe the virtues of the saint and carry out the respective work with total dedication, commitment and joy. It was followed by a dinner shared by all the participants.

**Combined Meeting** : On May 10, 2020, Jesuits working at Jesuit Bhavan – Tezpur, SXC – Sonabheel and St. John's, Balipara in Tezpur Diocese had a combined meeting at SXC, Sonabheel to assess and review the precarious situation arisen on account of the COVID – 19 lockdown. All of us appraised the relief works rendered by us to the needy people and decided to continue it. To identify the needy it was suggested that survey should be conducted to collect the data and on the basis of priority urgent cases should be addressed. Since Government is distributing food material through PDS, we too, felt that our role should be to help the needy to tap the relief materials distributed from the distribution centres. Another area where we could make our contribution is to conduct awareness program about the Corona virus through Whatsapp messages, display of flex printing and giving talks to the people in small groups. We, too, agreed to distribute preventive measures like masks, soaps etc. at the earliest. At the end of the meeting, SXC, Sonabheel served us sumptuous food which all of us had been missing so far due to COVID 19 lockdown. SXC, Sonabheel, thank you very much for hosting the meeting and dinner.

Hope to have many more occasions of coming together in near future to collectively respond to the situation and bring some relief to the lives of the afflicted people.

**Rosary & Holy Mass** : On May 14, 2020, in response to the call of Pope Francis for a day of prayer, fasting and works of charity in order to implore God's help to the suffering humanity caused by the corona virus pandemic, we, together with the GCS Staff members and domestic workers, had the recitation of five decades of rosary followed by the Holy Mass. Fr Thomas presided over at 11.00 A.M. Fr Thomas in his introduction explained the intention of Pope Francis for the day and invited us to pray to overcome the Corona virus which has taken the whole world in its tight grip. Soon after the Holy Mass we had our lunch with the staff members of GCS and domestic workers in Fathers' refectory. On May 31, 2020, we had a common rosary with workers to conclude the month dedicated to Mother Mary. Fr Pius led the rosary and helped the participants to express their devotion to Mother Mary, who is very dear to us.

## Foreign Mission

### ROME

Anselm was happy to see all the lay staff joining the work from 18 May under strict instructions of following the healthcare norms described by the Civil Authorities. To commence the regular working schedule, Curia community had a special Holy Eucharistic celebration presided over by R.P. General. Observing the feast of Our Lady of the Way (Madonna della Strada), all the deceased members of respective Provinces and Families were specially remembered with gratitude, and prayers were invoked for the healing of those affected by COVID-19. The message of R.P. General centred on the closeness and accompaniment of Our Lady of the Way in all difficult times, especially in a post-lockdown phase of life and work in the General Curia.

During lockdown, many Curia members made their annual retreat in the House itself. The Curia has now opened its door only for the Jesuits residing in the other Roman Houses; however, the prohibition continues for the lay people. Anselm strongly feels a radical change brought about by this pandemic in dealing with the Bank. Before going to the Bank for any kind of transaction, he now needs a prior appointment with the Bank officials.

No one is allowed to enter into the Bank, and all the transactions are done outside the premise. Anyone coming without an appointment, is sent back home.

In March and April, COVID-19 had heavily disrupted the daily life of International College of Gesù. However, the month of May brought a great relief for Nirmal and his community members the lockdown was phased out from 18 May and allowed the Churches, parks and other public places to reopen. The Church of Gesù also was reopened for the public Holy Masses and for the confessions with certain restrictions and preventive measures. Gesù community still maintains the normative social distancing in all common places. Guests are still not allowed in the community.

On 20 May, a special Community Prayer Meet was organized for the repose of R.P. Adolfo Nicolás. On 23 May, a requiem Holy Mass was offered in Gesù Church for R.P. Nicolás presided over by R.P. Arturo Sosa, Superior General. Only a few representatives from all Roman Houses were allowed to participate in the Eucharistic celebration. On 29 May, the outgoing members of the community were given farewell. During the Holy Mass, all 19 outgoing members were remembered with gratitude with best wishes for their future mission. The regular classes for the current Academic Year came to an end on 29 May. Although all the classes were held online during lockdown, the students have more than enough materials to study and prepare themselves for the exams, which will begin immediately after the final session of regular classes. The exam pressure has forced the Scholastics to stay under another lockdown in their rooms amidst class notes and books.

Although, the doors of Collegio Roberto Bellarmino was reopened on 4 May for the free movement of the community members, Kulwant never ventured out of his house until the end of May. The Minister of the house provided two face masks to each member of the community. He also reminded them all of some important safety measures to be observed in and outside the community. Maintaining one meter of distance during meals, Mass and community recreation; not to touch the bread and fruit without disposable gloves and not to sneeze or cough in front of others are still some of the basic rules until further notice. Despite the fact that one could go out of the community, the House Consulters decided that the community would wait for few months before opening its door for the outsiders – Jesuits and non-Jesuits alike. As a result, from May 12 to May 15,

R.P. Johan Verschueren, Delegate of R.P. General for International Roman Houses (DIR) made his annual canonical visit of the community via Zoom. All were pleased and enriched by talking to him personally, even though the time was limited to 20 minutes. On 20 May at 6.30 P.M., the whole community gathered in the House Chapel to offer the Holy Mass for the eternal repose of R.P. Adolfo Nicolás. On the eve of 23 May, P. Rector offered the Holy Eucharist for the outgoing members of the community. A hymn in Swahili language, “E E Mfumu Yamba Makabu”, sung by our African brothers during the offertory made the Mass more animated, devotional and prayerful. Thereafter, in honor of the outgoing members, the community members enjoyed the barbecue in the House courtyard.

Linus is getting healthier day by day and has no more special diet as doctors prescribed it earlier. He is able to give lectures as usual and had four courses in the Second Semester. As all the other Professors, he too used Online methods to continue the academic activities, especially in the field of evangelizing the world through the celebration of faith: rituals and festivals. In between the academic assignments, he is busy writing the “Position” on the Servant of God, Father Constant Lievens, in view of his beatification and canonization. Recently the Commission for the Cause of Saints has come up with new norms on how to write the Position, due to which he has to update what he has already written last year. This Position is to prove that Father Lievens was truly virtuous and that he lived a life of total commitment to Jesus as a Jesuit. Once this position is submitted to the commission experts on history, theology and spirituality they would evaluate it and finally a team of Cardinals will have to give their final word. Let us continue our prayer for the beatification of the Servant of God.

One of the major satisfactions from the ongoing exploration of different online teaching methods for Prem was the online corrections of the final Dissertations. The on-the-spot corrections on the computer screen eased the work of students, because they benefitted a lot by not being obliged to present the printed copies, and thereby, not struggling to figure out the scribbled corrections indicated by the Professors on the pages, sometimes indecipherable. Joint Diploma in Integral Ecology, an Inter-University project coordinated by him was concluded with the final online Workshop. Since a good number of students hail from different parts of Italy, the presence and participation in the online lessons and workshops were more than usual. Most of the exams

at Gregorian University are being conducted online – a new experience for the students as well as for the Professors, which has also opened new avenues of learning and teaching in the near future!

## GUYANA

The whole world is affected by the pandemic Covid-19. On 6th June, there were 153 cases confirmed, 77 recovered and 12 died in Guyana. It has a long border with Brazil and most of our mission stations are situated on the border. The Tosaos (the head of the village), catechists and health workers are looking after their villages with renewed vigor and zest. The indigenous people are helping one another in their need.

Fr. Elias Surin, SJ has come down to his Jesuit community, St. Ignatius Lethem in Rupununi from Pakaraima Mountains since April. He is cherishing his community life with Fr. Amar Bage, SJ Fr. Edwin Anthony, SJ and Fr. Ronald Fernandes, SJ. Sr. Helena, Sr. Crecencia, Sr. Nishi and Sr. Sosan, the Ursuline Sisters of Tildonk in Karasabai, South Pakaraimas, are courageously standing with the parishioners through their ceaseless prayers and valuable presence during this pandemic. The Sunday Masses are streamed live in social media.

Fr A. Amar Bage, SJ, as the Parish Priest, served five precious years in Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church Hosororo, Mabaruma. He has given remarkable contributions to the faithful in terms of renewing and reviving the Christian Communities in all the 34 villages in his parish. The youth groups are vibrant. He opened the library for the parishioners, completed three church buildings and one community centre. He conducted many leadership programs, catechists training programs and music seminars.

In the month of March, Fr. A. Amar Bage is transferred from parish ministry in Our Lady of Lourdes, Hosororo, Mabaruma to St Ignatius mission Lethem in Rupununi to begin a new educational apostolate. This is a new mission in Guyana. The name of this program is Jesuit Worldwide Learning - Higher Education at the Margins (JWL). JWL is a collaborative global partnership comprised of organizations, institutions, companies, and above all, people, to provide tertiary education to those who would otherwise not have access to higher learning/education opportunities. Training/education is

available in both online as well as on-site. Fr A. Amar Bage, SJ is on-site facilitator as well as supervisor for this program. The head quarter of this program is in Geneva, Switzerland.

Fr. Arturo Sosa, SJ Superior General of the Society of Jesus, has appointed Fr. Peter Mclsaac, SJ (54) to lead the Jesuits in Guyana and Jamaica as Regional Superior. He will take up his new role on July 1st, 2020. He succeeds Fr. Christopher Llanos, SJ who will be returning to Canada for medical treatment following recent health concerns.

On 31st May, at the Pentecost Holy Eucharist at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception Brickdam, Georgetown, Bishop Francis Alleyne, OSB said that just as the apostles received the gift of the Holy Spirit and were freed of feelings of hate, judgement and revenge on the first Pentecost day, he is hoping that as Guyana awaits the outcome of the recount of the regional and national election, the Spirit of Pentecost will rest on the nation of Guyana, our families and workplaces, filling us with a spirit of new insights and doing things in new ways.

We, the missionaries in Guyana from Ranchi, extend our heartfelt thanks and congratulations to Fr. Joseph MarianusKujur, SJ for his loving service to the Ranchi Province and the entire Society of Jesus. Our prayerful support and best wishes to our new Provincial Fr. Ajit Kumar Xess, SJ

The community mourned the death of our formal General Fr. Adolfo Nicolas. Until the cremation, we had had special prayer services and Holy Masses offered to pay homage to Fr. Adolfo Nicolas. Thanks to our scholastics for taking great interest in conducting special prayer services and Eucharistic Adoration to express our heartfelt gratitude to Fr. Adolfo Nicolas whose governance and leadership God has blessed our Society abundantly.

At this time of lock down, scholastics had taken a project each of reading books and sharing it in the group accompanied by Fr. Superior. On 7th June, the Scholastics shared their book reading and gave critical analysis of their books. It was a wonderful sharing and inspiring to listen to each other and be enriched in knowledge.
