There was a wonderful celebration of the Final Profession of our Novice Master, Fr. Sylverius Chermako, SJ, on 8th of December. The solemn Holy Eucharist began at 9:30 A.M. sharp as scheduled. Fr. Provincial, Ajit Kumar Xess, SJ, the main celebrant was accompanied by Fr. Camil Kerketta, SJ, Fr. Ferdinand Kullu, SJ, Fr. Medard Xalxo, SJ and Fr. Sylverius on the Altar. Fr. Medard, in his homily, shed light on the importance of the final profession in Jesuit life underlining that it invites one 'to be a servant of all'.

The novices, through their beautiful music and singing, made the liturgy more solemn and mesmerised all present there. Thanks to the good weather, due to which the entire ceremony took place smoothly outside, on Jharna lawn. Around 170 to 180 priests, nuns, benefactors, friends and family members of Fr. Sylverius graced the occasion by their valuable presence. The short felicitation program, soon after the final blessing, gave novices, pre-novices, family members and all invited, the opportunity to wish the newly professed Fr. Sylverius. The family members felicitated and congratulated, in a special way both Fr. Provincial Ajit and Fr. Sylverius by offering each of them a goat. All enjoyed the fellowship meal and the whole program ended by 3.00 P.M. After these enjoyments and festivities we had one full day of rest. Thereafter we resumed our normal novitiate life. We were assigned the task of reading the life of a Jesuit saint and then summarizing it. Everybody worked hard and tried to give the best possible. We drew inspirations from these saints for our life. This exercise reminded us of the words of Pope Francis, "Sanctity is for everyone, saints are not 'supermen' who are 'born perfect,' but rather are ordinary people who followed God 'with all their hearts.'"

Due to cold weather, from December 21 onwards there was a little change in our routine: rising at 5:45 A.M. and the first period at 9:30 A.M. Soon after these, we were busy in external and internal preparation for Christmas. We took a week to prepare four cribs. We kept our house simple and abstained from much decoration as per the guidelines given by Ranchi Archdiocese, namely to have simple but meaningful Christmas celebration. For our spiritual preparation, we had novena prayer and a day of recollection and

confession on December 17. Due to ongoing pandemic, there this time there was no carol singing. We took part neither in the Vigil Mass nor in the morning Mass in ATC. We had our Christmas vigil Mass in the novitiate chapel at 10 P.M. Fr. Master presided over the Mass. Certainly, the Covid-19 did not allow us the way we used to celebrate Christmas every year, but what it could not stop us from doing, is to have the heartfelt joy of having Emmanuel amidst us.

In the month of December, the number of serious patients surged in the Province. Many Jesuits were/are admitted in different hospitals: Late Br. Basil Tirkey, Fr. Patric Xalxo, late Fr. Linus Dungdung and Fr. Ranjit Horo. Novices were required to help out these sick brothers of ours. Thus, almost all the second year novices, who couldn't go for Hospital Experiment due to the Covid -19, got a good chance to serve these sick members.

The health of our superior Fr. K.C. Philip was also not good (due to Cervical spondylosis & diffuse osteoporosis which cause a strong giddiness) and was admitted in Ara Gate hospital. Because of this he couldn't attend the final profession of Fr. Novice Master on December 8. Now, he is back to the community. He is improving in his health but he still needs an attendant. He is going through physiotherapeutic treatment twice a week.

We celebrated the birthday of three of our brothers, namely Nss. Akash Xaxa, Pawan Kandulna, and Nelson Hassa Purty on on December 21, 23 and 26 respectively.

As for the Jharna Spirituality Centre is concerned, Frs. Edwin, Camil, Sylvester, Jyoti Paul were involved in giving retreats, triduums and recollections: Fr Edwin and Fr Camil, both of them prepared the St Anne's Novices and the Ursuline Novices for their first profession which took place on 08 December. The Jesuit Community in Lohardaga is involved in educational, social, and spiritual ministry. All the hostelers are sent home due to the pandemic. The campus looks rather shabby and bushy without the children. Sch. John Fabian Ekka together with "Bombay" (his co-worker) and Fr. Ranjit Lakra, S.J.

tried to change the look of the campus by pruning hedges and by clearing the field for the cultivation of vegetables and flowers. Sch. John also, together with the co-workers of the community, cleaned the graveyard for 2nd of November. Fr. Praful Toppo, the parish priest of Lohardaga blessed the tombs. He also blessed the people, assembled at the graveyard to pray and to pay homage to the departed.

Due to the Covid-19, the feast of St. Stanislaus Kostka was celebrated only by the campus people the big group. However, Fr. Alex Toppo, Fr. John Jyoti Kujur, and Sch. Ajay Paulus Minj from the Catholic Press, Ranchi paid a visit to know about and be with the Jesuit Community in Lohardaga. Fr. Anand Erget from Simdega Diocese lived for few days in Jesuit Community as he went through rural physiotherapy. Sch. John Fabian had been to Jharsugra for the burial of his Bari Maa (his mother's sister) late Emerencia Baxla, who expired on 16 November 2020. Condolence to John and the members of the bereaved family.

On 20th November Mr. Rajesh Dungdung, the BDO of Lohardaga block visited the community to share and cherish the friendship. Fr. Philemon Ekka, S.J. and Sch. John represented the Lohardaga Jesuit community in the Jubilee Celebration of Fr. Nicholas Tete, S. J. in Gumla. Mr. Kishor Minj, who lived in the hostel as a student and now as a teacher, celebrated his birthday in the Jesuit community. Thanks for his silent but cheerful service to the hostel, school, and the community. Apart from conducting online classes and registration of the students Fr. Philemon Ekka, S.J. made several trips to Gumla to complete the pending work of his pension.

Fr. Sushil Tirkey, the Director of AROUSE Lohardaga, and the team are still involved in relief work activities. They have distributed dry food, masks, sanitizers, and other relief materials provided by the Province, JESA and some individuals. They, under the Lok Manch programme, are supporting the old, widows and the physically challenged to obtain the social security benefits provided by the Government and assisting the villagers and the migrant labourers find jobs under MNREGA Schemes.

AROUSE Lohardaga also distributed piglets and goats to some the Self-Help Group members and 500 fruit-plants to farmers and the study guides. The study centres in 20 villages had been closed due to lockdown but some of the villages had made an alternative arrangement for the education of their children. Now with the request of the parents and children we have started the evening study following all the precautionary measures and the protocol to avoid corona virus. At the same time, we conducted the Spoken English class for the college students.

But the sudden change in weather brought cold and cough all the community members so all went through Corona test. Those diagnosed as negative are set free and the suspects are under observation. Fr. Dharmasheel Kujur, SJ is suffering from sciatica and he was taken to Debuka Nursing Home, Ranchi for check-up. Now he is taking precaution and recovering in the community.

Collegio San Roberto Bellarmino: With the start of Advent Season, Collegio Bellarmino, the community of Deepak and Kulwant began its internal and external preparation for Christmas. There was a recollection for the Community from 27 to 29 November. The theme of the recollection was: The Importance of Christmas for the Jesuits of today. Enough time was allotted for personal prayer and for the group sharing. The recollection ended with the Holy Mass in which the community members renewed their Vows. The House Chapel, the Aula of the community and the Refectory were decorated already during the second week of Advent. On 24 December, there was a Christmas Vigil Mass at 18:30 presided over by Jean Piere Sonnet. After the supper, there was community Christmas Celebration with some cultural representations from different countries. On behalf of South Asia Assistancy, Ravi Dusi (AND) sang a classical Christmas carol which was well appreciated by all. The Christmas celebration concluded with the exchange of gifts.

AMMAN (JORDAN)

There used to be special Christmas celebrations with the refugees. Again this was not possible in 2020. There are various groups. The Jesuit community decided to make a good Christmas packet with gifts, home - made good cookies, cakes etc. One hundred and forty packets were prepared by four of us Jesuits as a token of LOVE on behalf of us. The group of twenty was invited at one time and a Christmas message was given. Everyone was invited to share about their association with Jesuit Center and the year 2020. It was touching to listen to them.

Every Friday is a complete 24 hrs. Lockdown here. 25th December and the New year happen to fall on Fridays. Christmas was celebrated during the day on 24th and on 26th due to the restrictions of numbers participating in the Holy Mass. On 28th we were out of Amman, more than 300 kms. for a Community outing. We were able to visit a desert called "Wadi Rum". It's a desert valley with refined sand and red granite rocks in southern Jordan. The other visited place is called Petra – the capital of Nabatean Empire in the 1st Century BC. It's a historic and archaeological city in southern Jordan. The city's structures were carved and cut out of red colored mountains. There are massive tombs, a theatre followed by roman annexation and later with the Byzantine influence some churches and monasteries. Petra is considered one of the present Seven Wonders of the World.

Known as the Management Guru and a pioneer in Development Action for 23 years at XISS and at CENDERET in XIM Bhubaneswar for approximately 10 years, Fr. Bogaert gave his best for Development Action and Management Education as the name XIDAS suggests, founding it on 3rd December 1995 at the Sneh Sadan apartments belonging to the Diocese of Jabalpur. The Institute was shifted to the present site at Tilhari on 3rd Dec.2002 at the inaugural function under the Directorship of Fr. Panka Toppo,

SJ and at the hands of the Chief Guest Col. Ajay Narayan Mushran, Finance Minister of M.P. along with Rt. Rev. Pascal Topno, SJ, Archbishop of Bhopal and His Excellency, the Ambassador of Belgium Mr. Guy Trouveroy and Mrs. Trouveroy including many other dignitaries

Sole Jesuit B-School in MP: In the last 25 years XIDAS has had a wide network of development intervention with the local, national and international NGOs, Govt. departments, industrial units under CSR and church bodies for the rural and the urban poor through watershed management, health and sanitation, entrepreneurship development programme and social activism for the project displaced people. The institute has also conducted dozens of short courses for the Church and the lay leaders as well as for the Panchayati Raj Institutions and development functionaries of the private and the public sector. Currently XIDAS has AICTE approved Post Graduate Diploma Programmes in Rural Management, Human Resource Management, Finance Management and Marketing Management.

Alexius Ekka, SJ, Director XIDAS, along with other Religious and the devout congregation, the Silver Jubilee Function was inaugurated by Lt. Gen.
